

Aged Dependent Relative visa (subclass 114) Document Checklist Vietnam

Important:

- Other Family category (subclass 114, 115 and 116) visas for applicants residing in the Mekong and North Asia Regions, including Vietnam residents, are processed by Perth Visa and Citizenship Office in Australia.

- Please note that all foreign language documents submitted with your application must be accompanied by a certified English translation.
- Either of the following document types will be accepted when submitted with your application:
 - · A certified copy of an original document, or
 - Scanned or electronic copies of the original document where the quality of the scan is a minimum of 300 dpi in 24 colour and saved as a jpg image or pdf file at a good quality setting.
- Certified copies must be authorised or stamped as being true copies of the original document by the local authority in Laos or Vietnam. In Australia, documents may be certified by a person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the Statutory Declarations Act, 1959. Do not send photocopies of certified documents. Biometrics Collection: most clients lodging visa applications in Vietnam, regardless of nationality, need to attend in person to provide their fingerprints and a digital facial photograph as part of visa application processing. The collection of biometrics is conducted at, VFS Global, in Ho Chi Minh City or Hanoi. Please take your original passport with you. You must also provide the following:		
Certified copy of the Birth Certificate for each visa applicant.		
Certified copies of the biodata pages of the passport or travel document (including the photograph) for each visa applicant.		
Certified copy of all pages of the applicant's current Household Registration Book.		
Original Curriculum Vitae for each person who is 18 years of age or over and included in the application.		
Two recent passport size photographs of you and any other person included in the application. You should print the name of the person on the back of each photograph.		
Evidence of your current marital status.		
Evidence of your relationship with the sponsor.		
Evidence that the sponsor is an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen. For the New Zealand citizens – evidence of length of residence in Australia and of continuing links with Australia.		
Evidence of your financial dependency on your relative in Australia.		
Original Judicial Record Card Number 2 issued from local Service of Justice.		

Applicants who have lived in any other country for 12 months or more in the last 10 years since turning 16 years of age must provide an original copy of police clearance certificate from those countries – including their current country of residence. For Australia, note that a National Police Certificate from Australian Federal Police, Complete Disclosure is required.
