Important:

- Please note that all foreign language documents submitted with your application **must** be accompanied by a certified English translation.
- Either of the following document types will be accepted when submitted with your application:
 - A certified copy of an original document, or
 - Scanned or electronic copies of the original document where the quality of the scan is a minimum of 300 dpi in 24 colour and saved as a jpg image or pdf file at a good quality setting.
- Certified copies must be authorised or stamped as being true copies of the original document by the local authority in Vietnam. In Australia, documents may be certified by a person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the Statutory Declarations Act, 1959. - Do not send photocopies of certified documents.

Where to Apply:

You must apply for this visa on paper.

In Vietnam, you can lodge your application at **Australian Visa Application Centre**.

A copy of the bio-data page of the sponsor's Australian or travel document.		
A copy of the child's birth certificate.		
A copy of (every page) of the family book / household register where the child currently lives.		
If the child is an adopted child, a copy of the adoption papers or the Adoption Compliance Certificate.		
<p>Evidence that the sponsor is an Australian citizen, the holder of an Australian permanent visa, or an eligible New Zealand citizen.</p> <p>For New Zealand citizens</p> <p>Evidence of length of residence in Australia and of continuing links with Australia.</p>		
Additional information required: if the child is under 18 years of age		
<p><u>Police Certificates for the sponsor and their partner:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A copy of an Australian Federal Police (AFP) National Police Check (Complete Disclosure), if the sponsor (and their partner, if any) has spent a total of 12 months or more cumulatively in Australia since turning 16 years of age; and • A copy of Police Certificates from each country in which the sponsor (and their partner, if any) has spent a total of 12 months or more cumulatively in the last 10 years since turning 16 years of age. • If the sponsor is divorced, a copy of the divorce certificate. • If the sponsor is a widow/er, a copy of their former partner's death certificate. <p><u>Police Certificates for the applicant who is aged 17 years or over:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A copy of Police Certificates from any country that the applicant have spent a total of 12 months or more cumulatively in the last 10 years since turning 16 years of age, including the applicant(s) current country of residence.

<p><u>Consent for the child to migrate to Australia</u></p> <p>Where a non-migrating parent or other person has the legal right to determine where the child can live, please provide:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Written consent for the child to migrate to Australia from the non-migrating parent using the template available on our website https://hcmc.vietnam.embassy.gov.au/files/hchi/Consent%20to%20grant%20an%20Australian%20visa%20to%20a%20child%20under%20age%20of%2018%20years.%20En%20v110119.pdf <p>The signature of the non-migrating parent on the consent must be verified by the local authorities/public notary; and</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Certified copy of the non-migrating parent's Identity Card; and For adopted children, please also provide the official Decision on Recognition of Child Adoption, including a Record of Receipt and Handing-Over a Child Adoption. <p>If it is not possible to obtain a consent from the non-migrating parent, you will need to provide a court order stating that the migrating parent has sole custody and is allowed to move the child to Australia.</p>		
<p>Additional information required: if the child is 18 years or over</p>		
<p>A copy of the applicant's Curriculum Vitae.</p>		
<p>A copy of a Single Status Certificate for the applicant.</p>		
<p><u>Questionnaire for Dependent Children aged 18 and over</u></p>		
<p>Police Certificates from any country that the applicant have spent a total of 12 months or more cumulatively in the last 10 years since turning 16 years of age, including the applicant(s) current country of residence.</p> <p>Important information on what Police Certificate(s) are required from other countries is specified at this link, we will not accept any other type of Police Certificate. For Vietnam, the Judicial Record Card Number 2 issued by the local Service of Justice is required. <p>Evidence that the applicant is and has been financially dependent on their visa-holding parent for the basic needs of food, shelter and clothing for at least 12 months prior to application lodgement, and how long this support has been provided. Evidence may include bank statements, money transfers, rent receipts, etc.</p>		
<p>If the child is 18 years of age or over and is a full-time student, evidence of the child's enrolment, academic records and active participation in a post-secondary course of study.</p> <p>If the child is not a full-time student, a detailed explanation about what they have been doing since either turning 18 or since leaving school or post-secondary studies.</p>		
<p>If the child is 18 years of age or over and has a disability, evidence from a qualified medical practitioner that the child has a total or partial loss of bodily or mental functions and this stops them working.</p>
