## Medical Treatment (Subclass 602) Visa Application Checklist

**Important:**

- You **should** complete your Australian medical examination **before** you lodge this visa. See: <https://online.immi.gov.au/lusc/register>
- Please note that a separate visa application is required for each person of the travelling party. This subclass does not permit children or other dependent applicants to be included in the same application as their parents.
- Ensure you lodge your visa application at least **four (4) weeks** prior to your intended travel date. You should ensure that application forms are fully completed and all relevant supporting documentation is provided. While in exceptional cases, an applicant may be requested to provide more information by their case officer, in most cases a decision on a visa application is made solely on the information provided at time of application.
- **All** foreign language documents submitted with your application **must** be accompanied by a certified English translation - unless indicated otherwise in the visa application checklist.
- Certified copies need to be authorised or stamped as being true copies of the original document by the local authority in Vietnam. In Australia, documents may be certified by a person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the Statutory Declarations Act, 1959. We will not accept photocopies of certified documents. - Please provide us with your email address as this will enable us to communicate with you more efficiently.

**Biometrics Collection:** most clients lodging visa applications in Vietnam, regardless of nationality, need to attend in person to provide their fingerprints and a digital facial photograph as part of visa application processing. The collection of biometrics is conducted at VFS Global in Hanoi, Ho Chi Minh City or Danang. Please take your original passport with you. ## AUSTRALIAN HEALTH REQUIREMENT

You will need to meet Australia's health requirement in order to be granted a medical treatment visa. Please complete your health examination **before** you lodge this visa application.

To do this, you will need to create an [ImmiAccount](#) and generate your own Health Assessment Portal (HAP) ID and medical request letter. You will then need to take this letter to a panel medical clinic to complete your health assessment.

Once you have generated your own HAP ID, please let us know what it is. This will make it easier for us to locate your medical examinations once you lodge your visa.

Certified copy of your National Identity Card (this document can be in Vietnamese).		
Certified copy of all pages of the Household Registration Book (this document can be in Vietnamese).		
Evidence of your current marital status		

<b>Information relating to your medical treatment</b>		
Details of the referral source: Doctor's name, name of clinic, address of clinic, telephone number and email address.		
Details of the medical practitioner/facility in Australia where you will receive treatment: Doctor's name, name of clinic, address of clinic, telephone number and email address.		
<p>Written confirmation from the medical practitioner/facility, on official letterhead that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• they agree to treat the patient;</li> <li>• the nature and estimated duration of the treatment;</li> <li>• proposed dates of treatment and/or consultation;</li> <li>• details of fees associated with the treatment;</li> <li>• a proposed date of admission to the relevant medical facility</li> </ul>		
<p>If the treatment is to be provided by a private hospital or private medical practitioner (including a private medical practitioner in a public hospital), written confirmation from the private hospital/practitioner, on official letterhead that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• they undertake to treat the applicant; and they are satisfied as to the arrangements for the payment of all costs related to the treatment (including fees for consultation, treatment and hospital accommodation); <b>or</b></li> <li>• the relevant hospital, medical practitioner and/or other health care providers have agreed to give their services free</li> </ul>		
<p>If the treatment is to be provided by a public hospital/clinic in Australia, written confirmation from the relevant Australian State or Territory Health Authority that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the authority undertakes to treat the applicant in that public hospital; and</li> <li>• no Australian will be disadvantaged</li> <li>• the authority is satisfied as to the arrangements for the payment of all costs related to the treatment (including fees for consultation, treatment and hospital accommodation).</li> </ul>		
<b>Financial Requirements</b>		
<p>You must provide evidence that you have enough money to support yourself while you are in Australia and medical treatment.</p> <p>You must also show that you have made arrangements for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• your treatment</li> <li>• other expenses related to your stay in Australia</li> <li>• the expenses of anyone who comes with you to Australia (this includes an organ donor's expenses).</li> </ul> <p><b>Evidence of financial status, including:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recent bank statements</li> <li>• Recent credit card statements showing available balance</li> <li>• Income from rental properties, shares or other income generating investments</li> <li>• Certified copies of any asset ownership certificates (such as house and land) you would like us to consider when assessing your visa application</li> </ul> <p><b>If employed by a company, please provide:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Details of employment including; position, salary/wage, contact details of the current employer (address, telephone number and contact name)</li> </ul> <p><b>If self-employed, please provide:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A certified copy of the business licence and personal/business income tax statements for the previous financial year</li> </ul>		

Additional Information required for children under 18 years of age		
<p>If the visa applicant is under 18 years of age, and intends on travelling without one or both their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) please provide the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A completed <a href="#">Form 1229</a> signed by any non-accompanying parent(s) or legal guardian(s); or</li> <li>• An original letter signed by any non-accompanying parent(s) or legal guardian(s) consenting to the grant of the visa. This letter must clearly state the child's name, name of the consenting parent(s)/guardian(s), and consent for the child to travel to Australia with the person accompanying them; or</li> <li>• A court order from Australia or Vietnam permitting the removal of the child.</li> </ul> <p>Please note that Form 1229 or the letter must be certified by the local authorities.</p>		
<p>A certified copy of the National Identity Card of the non-accompanying parent or legal guardian (this document can be in Vietnamese).</p>
